Scott Fulton has been working on Haida art prints in his new series with the bentwood box and Chilkat Blanket design prints. His work has been added to the Smithsonian Native Museum collection in Washington D.C.

Kathy Paddock is designing Haida style jewelry made from abalone, shell, bone, pearls, semi precious stones and trade beads. Trade beads strongly influenced trade with Haida people since the 17th and 18th century. She is using modern materials to recreate jewelry from our past. You are invited to please come and join us.
